Sam Perricone, 1920-2011



A giant in the citrus industry, a great leader and a founding member of the Board of Advisors of Villa Scalabrini, Sam Perricone died on July 8, 2011. He was 91.

An extremely generous man, Perricone gave his time and money to many charitable endeavors, Villa Scalabrini being one of them.

Born in Pueblo, Colorado on January 8, 1920, Perricone lost his father by age 13 and had to leave school to go to work and help the family. They moved to Los Angeles in 1935. By age 16, Perricone was picking, packing and transporting lemons to the Los Angeles Grand Central Market.

The citrus business became his life. A successful businessman, Perricone helped many people get started and he could be seen every morning walking the Los Angeles Wholesale Produce Market, before reaching his office at 6 am. And there he was until being hospitalized one week before his death. He passed 15 years to the day after his wife, Mary.

Perricone is survived by three children, Lucy, Joe and Sam, 18 grandchildren, 34 great-grandchildren and two great-great-grandchildren. He will be missed by all who knew him.

Villa Scalabrini thanks the Perricone family for the many generous donations received in Sam Perricone's memory and honor.

He'll be happy to help anybody with new ideas and suggestions.

These angels have no halos or wings, but they're easily recognizable by everyone. Look for a warm smile, a giving heart, an understanding ear and a hand to hold. With their presence we feel secure and loved.

Yes, there are angels at the Villa: our residents and their families have told us so! Some of them have shown their appreciation for the special care and compassion their loved ones are receiving, others have asked us how they could do so. With this Christmas issue we have included an envelope for those who wish to join the benefactors of the Villa. As friends, you all like to see the Villa improve its service and appearance. For example, we are now planning to resurface our parking lot and add more covered spaces for the vans and cars of the Villa. Could you help with this project as your Christmas gift? Thank you!

Finally I would like to introduce Fr. Antonio De Angelis, the new Administrator's Assistant, recently arrived at the Villa from Vancouver, Canada. He was born in Brazil of Italian parents and ministered as Pastor in various parishes in the United States and Canada. We welcome him warmly as part of the Advisory Board and of the staff.




